LEAVE IT LOOSE!

What does 'Leave it Loose' mean?

Recyclable materials are easier to process if they are put into your brown bin loose – not in bags or boxes.

We work hard to reduce the levels of non recyclable materials (contamination) in our collections but we need your help.

It is important all recyclable items are placed in your brown bin loose, not inside bags, so the material can be sorted quickly and more efficiently at the recycling plant.

With your help we've improved our recycling rate and will continue to work with you to reduce the amount of waste put in black bins.



DON'T LET YOUR BIN GET LEFT BEHIND!

Why does 'Leave it Loose' matter?

It matters because items such as plastic bags, electronics and batteries cannot be recycled on our service. If contamination levels are too high, the sorting facility can reject our material, meaning we are charged extra for disposal.

This is why we don't empty brown bins containing items not currently recycled on our scheme. If we can't empty your bin due to contamination we will sticker your bin and write to you to explain why it wasn't emptied.

BROWN BIN

What happens to the items in your brown bin?



Mixed recycling is collected and taken to Buxton before being transferred to a recycling processor in the UK.





The items are tipped onto a conveyor belt and go through magnets, optical sorting equipment, and quality checks by hand to separate the material.





Once separated, the materials are baled up and sold as a product to be made into something new.

Your recycling can be made into:



New paper and cardboard products



- New food and drink cans
- Aeroplane parts
- Car parts



 Glass is remade into new glass (jars, bottles etc.)



- New plastic bottles & food packaging
- Clothing (e.g. football shirts)
- Drainage pipes

GREEN LIDDED BIN

What happens to your food and garden waste?

Your food and garden waste is taken to a specialist processing plant in Buxton where it is recycled into compost and used on local fields.



Food and garden waste is collected from your green lidded bin and taken to an in-vessel composting facility (IVC) in Buxton.

Organic waste is then mixed, shredded and transferred to sealed tunnels which are temperature controlled to optimise the composting process.



The final product is a fine compost which is used on local fields throughout High Peak.

Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment

Electrical items must not be put in any of your bins.

We offer a collection service for electrical items. Items will only be collected free if they are smaller than $30\text{cm} \times 40\text{cm}$.

Collection of larger items is a chargeable service.

We offer a chargeable collection service for items not suitable for reuse.




Collections take place every week, bookings must be made on our website by midnight on a Sunday for collection the next week.
